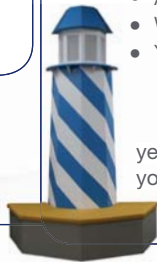

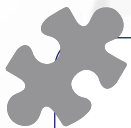

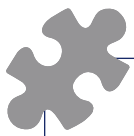

In the past, the bookstacks section of a library served one purpose... to house the collection. In today's media space, stacks (that's the hip word these days.. again) are also provide function, definition and shape of spaces. They're found in the perimeter of the media space and the interior of the space to create spaces for what we call **Functions**.

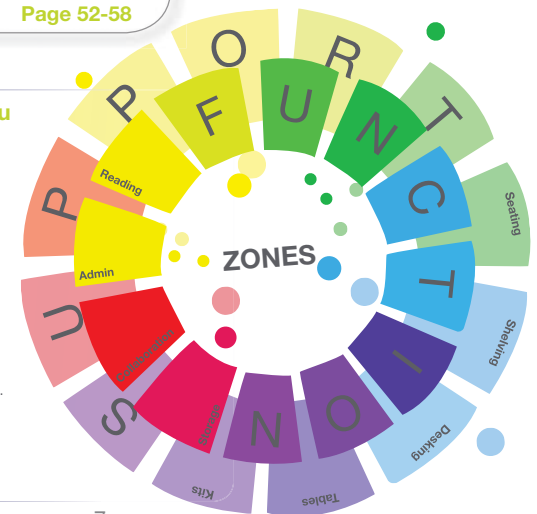

Elementary School

In this particular elementary media space remodel, the administration wanted to focus on the unique architecture of the space. Additionally, they wanted to emphasize *March is Reading month* in order to center the importance of reading among students. A natural zone for this would be the Commons Zone.

Other Zones in this space are Classroom and Makerspace. Stacks, appears in the perimeter as well as the center of the space to separate the two Classroom Zones.

This elementary space contains all 4 Zones, the combination of Functions in these Zones allows for collaboration with supervision.

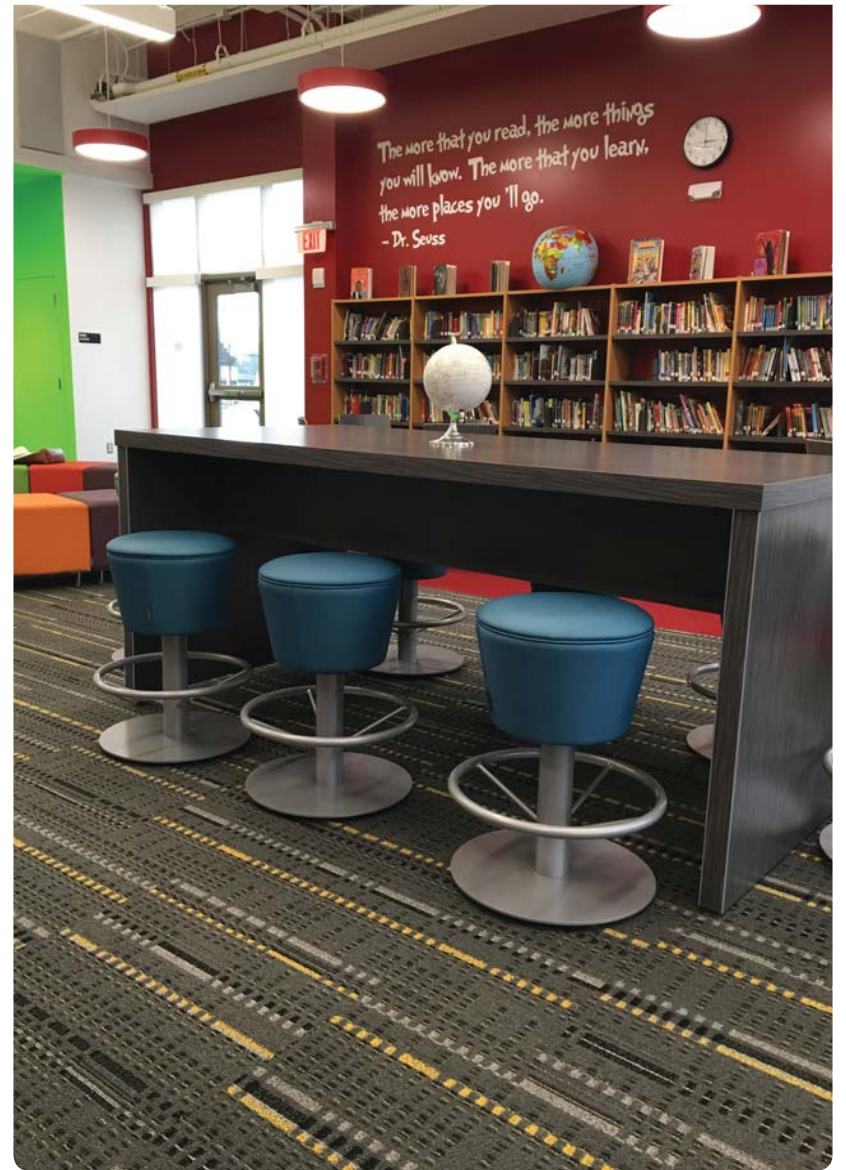

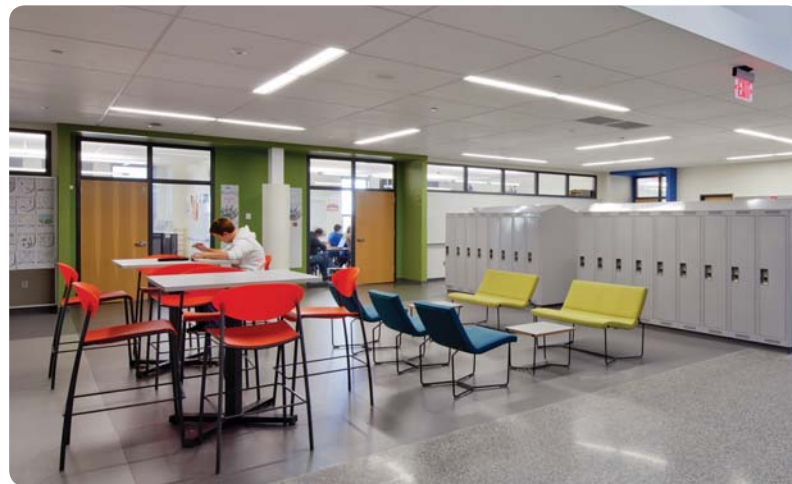
